He stated that the purpose of the meeting is to continue our budget workshops as the district prepares for the 2017-2018 school year. Mr. Lorentz and his administrative team would provide an overview of last week's workshop while this meeting would focus on capital work. He stated that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. Public participation opportunities would be available at the beginning and end of the meeting and, as stated in board policy, no person should speak for more than three minutes and each period of public participation would be limited to thirty minutes. Mr. Morales requested that speakers should state clearly their name and address as they approached the microphone; during special meetings, public participation would be limited to the topics on the agenda. Mr. Morales thanked all for their	

anticipated courtesy and cooperation. He pointed out the emergency exits, and the public session began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

PublicBoard President Ralph Morales opened the meeting for the first publicParticipationPresentation. No one came forward at this time.

Budget Board President Ralph Morales welcomed Superintendent of Schools John **Presentation:** Lorentz and asked for an introduction of this week's budget presentation. Mr. 2017 - 2018 Lorentz then introduced Assistant Superintendent for Business Paul Defendini who began his powerpoint presentation related to the 2017-2018 budget Capital development and, more specifically the capital work plan and a corresponding Presentation proposition for resident voters. He began his presentation emphasizing that the district would remain within the confines of the state mandated tax cap levy of .83% with a budget to budget increase of 2.15%; programs and services would remain intact during 2017-2018 and residents would receive rebate checks from the state. He reviewed the revenue expectations, the cost element summary, and the impact of a contingent budget on programs.

> Mr. Defendini moved into the discussion of the capital work that has been completed, that which is currently on-going and short term plans for the future. He reviewed the work associated with the Energy Performance Contracts and the beginning stages of the Bond 2016 work. He introduced a preliminary rendering of the pool center.

> Mr. Defendini reviewed the safety related facilities' projects, both at the district level and those that were specific to each of the school buildings. He outlined the in-house facility projects that have been completed in each of the buildings since the 2008-2009 school year.

Mr. Defendini reviewed the 2015 voter approved capital reserve established at a maximum not-to-exceed \$20 million. He explained that this reserve would be funded through year-end fund balances, the reallocation of reserves and/or interest. He stated that the expenditure of funds from this reserve would require voter approval. Proposition 2 on the May 16, 2017 Budget Vote and Election ballot would authorize the use of funds from this Buildings and Facilities Capital Reserve Fund for the specific purpose of districtwide bathroom renovation projects. Additional facilities work during 2017-2018 may include library and lecture hall updates at Farmingdale High School, locker room and main office renovations at the middle school, Makerspaces, ceiling replacements, lighting upgrades, locker and floor tiles replacement in the elementary schools.

Board member questions included requests for clarification on the Energy Performance Contracts, the Aquatic Center design, the scope of the bathroom renovations, the Makerspace locations, elementary school lockers, the project prioritization process, and the changes to the rear entrance of Farmingdale High School when the original pool structure is removed. Mr. Capobianco asked if the district had received any indication of the State Assembly and State Senate's budget proposals. Mr. Defendini stated that both had been received and were under review. He also stated that their was a wide disparity between the two plans.

The presentation concluded with a summary of the budget and the developing budget presentation calendar. Mr. Defendini stated that the presentation would be posted on the district's website (www.farmingdaleschools.org).
