Pledge of Allegiance Mr. Goldberg continued, stating that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. Feedback and questions should be directed to the Board's email account at boe@farmingdaleschools.org. Questions and comments would be responded to by members of the central administrative team and would be publicly reviewed at the next regular Board meeting. Mr. Goldberg thanked everyone for their anticipated courtesy and cooperation. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Superintendent's Update

MonthlyBoard President Michael Goldberg introduced Superintendent of Schools PaulUpdateDefendini and asked for his monthly update.

Mr. Defendini began his report with an update on the 2021-2022 budget development. He stated that the district had begun the work and will present information to the community in March. Although the district is not free and clear from making difficult program decisions, federal funding is likely to mitigate draconian reductions in services to our students. He also mentioned that the district looks forward to a collaborative budget season with the Board and the community at large.

Mr. Defendini stated that the work on the Aquatic Center was ongoing, even though this week's snow and next week's potential snow has slowed the progress. The mechanical work is on going; the pumping, filtration and draining systems are well underway. The next phase of the project will begin in March as the steel frame begins to emerge.

Mr. Defendini stated that the second semester of the 2020-2021 school year will begin on February 1. Students in Grades 8-12 had the opportunity to select a hybrid attendance model or remain on a fully remote schedule. Grades 6 and 7 began a small group/large group setting in the middle school.–

Mr. Defendini also announced a new initiative with the school lunch program. A questionnaire would be sent to remote students to see if they would be interested in a meal delivery system.

Finally, Mr. Defendini stated that due to Governor Cuomo's latest release of information and plans announced by Nassau County Executive Laura Curran, sports would be returning as of February 1. Mr. Zakian, Ms. Berkoski and Ms. Esposito, in the course of just a few days, were able to organize the new season's start, the mandatory COVID testing protocols, and the scheduling of athletic events.–

Mr. Defendini spoke of the snow days. Farmingdale Schools now has a very tight calendar and the use of snow days without instruction would need to be made up by adjusting the Memorial Day weekend schedule. Two days were used: the first in December and the second in January. Two days of live instruction will now be in

place on May 27 and May 28. If there were any further snow events, the district would be on a remote schedule; otherwise we would have to shorten the spring recess.

Mr. Defendini concluded his update by thanking the staff for all of their efforts as we continue to navigate the 2020-2021 school year. He stated that he had received a compliment recently from a high school parent who had stated that she was impressed with the thoughtfulness behind instructional decision and the high level of program delivery during some of the most challenging days. Mr. Defendini stated that it is the team at the table, the teachers, the support staff and the Board of Education that makes this happen.

	Mr. Espinosa reported on the Policy Committee meetings, which were attended by himself, Mrs. Lively and Mr. Giordano. He also attended the Farmingdale Public Library's trustee meeting. They are extending their winter hours until the end of March and remain closed on Sundays. Mr. Espinosa attended the January 14 Nassau BOCES budget development meeting. They are looking forward to some normalcy in September, 2021.
	Mrs. Lively reported on the Legislative Action Committee meeting. She stated that virtual visits to local elected officials were continuing. She was pleased to report that high school students have been joining in this important work. Any concerns from the community should be sent to either Dr. Brennan or Mr. Motisi so that they may be considered for future discussions with our state senators and assembly representatives. Mrs. Lively also reported on the Farmingdale Youth Council scholarship program.

Two scholarships, including the Murray Tuck and the Gary E. Karp Memorial Scholarship recognize students who have focused efforts on community service. Both scholarships are for \$1,000 each. Applications are available on the Youth Council's website and in the high school's Guidance office. The deadline is March 15.

Mrs. Soete reported on the Wellness Committee and the anticipated virtual Family Wellness event. Information would be available on the district's website.

Mr. Goldberg stated that he would be attending the district's audit committee meeting the next day.

Mr. Zakian stated that in January, the Board had the opportunity to review the first draft of the calendar. This second draft, which is recommended for adoption, changes the first day of school to September 2. Students would report on that Thursday and Friday and then would be out for Labor Day and two days for the observance of Rosh Hashanah. Mrs. Lively asked if we knew the last day of school in June, 2022. Mr. Zakian stated that we had not received the Regents exam schedule for next year. We anticipate that school will end on June 24.
