#### Call to Order

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mr. Goldberg, President of the Board of Education. In accordance with Governor Cuomo's Executive Order related to temporary modifications to Public Officers Law, the meeting was conducted in a virtual format to allow for the uninterrupted continuation of our important work. The Board meeting notice indicated that access to the meeting would be posted on the district's website at www.farmingdaleschools.org and a live feed would be available on www.youtube.com.

## Executive Session

Meeting reconvened in public session at 8:00 p.m.

Board President Michael Goldberg opened the meeting with the following statement:

Pursuant to Executive Order 202.1 (and subsequent orders closing District schools) issued by the Hon. Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York, signed March 12, 2020, and due to the concerns of the Board of Education for the Health and Safety of the community emanating from the current COVID-19 pandemic, there would be no in-person public access to the board meeting and instead the meeting will be live streamed and recorded. Access to the live stream could be had by accessing the school district's website

for a link that will bring you to a youtube site and the recording of the meeting can be accessed on www.farmingdaleschools.org. In addition, the public participation portion of the meeting was suspended by board resolution.

On a motion made by Mrs. D'Amico, seconded by Mr. Giordano, pursuant to the aforementioned Executive Order, the Board suspended the public participation portion of the meeting and therefore, accordingly, there would be no public participation at this Board meeting.

Mr. Goldberg continued, stating that the Board of Education was interested in encouraging members of the public to share their ideas, comments and questions. Feedback and questions should be directed to the Board's email account at boe@farmingdaleschools.org. Questions and comments would be publicly addressed at the next Board meeting. Mr. Goldberg thanked everyone for their anticipated courtesy and cooperation. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

### Superintendent's Update

## Monthly Report

Board President Michael Goldberg introduced Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini and asked for his monthly update. Mr. Defendini began with the sad news that a former Farmingdale High school graduate and current part time security aide for the district had passed away in a car accident two weeks prior. He stated that in the short time he had worked for the school district he had shown himself to be a valued member of our security staff. Mr. Defendini asked for a moment of silence to honor Anthony Cardillo.

Mr. Defendini continued in his update with comments related to the efforts of students, staff, teachers, administrators and families within the Farmingdale community as they have rallied to work together during the COVID-19 shut down of schools and businesses. He remarked on the instructional program that is on-going for our students, the efforts of the cafeteria staff as they prepare meals for the families within the district, the work of the operations, maintenance and security staff as they keep our schools clean and secure, the dedication of support staff as they keep the communication pathways open and the administrators as they consider ways to help maintain the fidelity of our work. Mr. Defendini remarked that the efforts in the greater community to support the first responders and their families is a testament to how we care for each other. This pandemic will bring us closer together and will not tear us apart. Mr. Defendini also thanked the Board of Education for their continued support of the work that we are tasked with, not just during these trying times, but always.

Budget Presentation - Michael Motisi Superintendent of Schools Paul Defendini introduced Assistant to the Superintendent for Business Michael Motisi, who was asked to present to the Board of Education an overview of the 2020-2021 school district budget prior to this evening's budget adoption. Mr. Motisi began with the uncertainty surrounding this year's budget vote. He stated that the Board of Education would be asked to continue with the budget calendar as established last summer, with the budget adoption scheduled for this evening and the Public Hearing scheduled for May 12, despite the fact that we already know that the May 19 vote date has been postponed to at least early June. He stated that this time frame was tentative and additional information would be provided as received through both the Governor's Office and the New York State Education Department. Mr. Motisi also stated that the budget presentation included current state aid proposals on the anticipated revenue slide; with the continued economic impact of COVID-19, the revenue may change.

Mr. Motisi presented this year's tax levy limit calculation, outlining the 2019-2020 approved budget, the calculation based on the allowable growth factor, which for this year was the CPI of 1.018%, and the addition back into the budget calculation of the capital local expenditures of just over \$5 million. This year's tax levy limit calculation is 2.78%.

Mr. Motisi provided details of the proposed revenue, which included a very small increase in state aid. As the state reviews the economic impact of COVID-19, it is anticipated that the revenue across the categories may be adjusted.

The Cost Element Summary was also provided to the Board of Education. There are increases in most categories, with larger percentage increases in transportation.

Mr. Motisi detailed the reductions in the budget that would be required based on a contingent budget. He outlined the impact that would have on the educational programs across the district.

A review of changes in state legislation, including a reduction in income limits for participation in STAR exemptions and changes in aid categories, was included in the presentation.

Mr. Motisi concluded his PowerPoint with the language included in the four propositions that will be on the ballot. There are two open seats on the Board of Education for the election side of this work.
